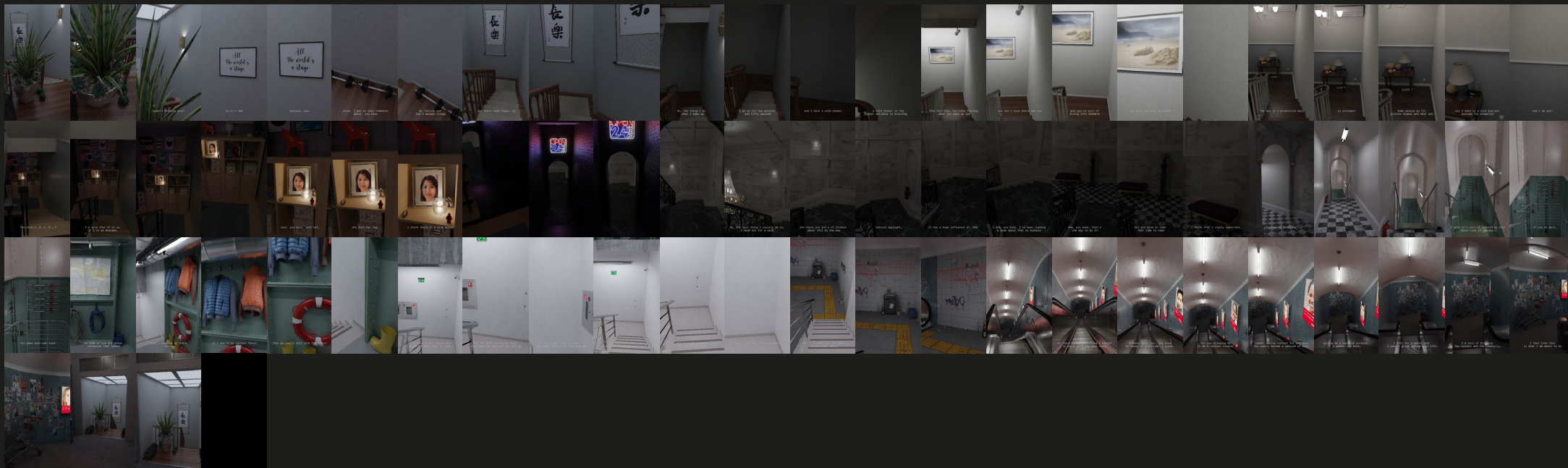

It means performing routines that prepare the body for performing the exact same routines again the next morning. On his way down, the vlogger offers tips on hygiene, fitness, nutrition, and other forms of self-optimization that are supposed to help increase productivity and get ahead both in life and on the job. The vlogger himself remains anonymous. He is not to be seen, only the house that he is moving through. At the end of the stairs, another flight starts. The house seems to be large, very large—as it soon turns out, it endlessly extends vertically, but without either windows or doors. The character of the architecture changes from floor to floor. It is no longer clear whether we are in a private or public space here—carpet flooring is followed by wooden floorboards, tiles, exposed concrete, and eventually an escalator before it all seems to start ... “Morning, guys!”

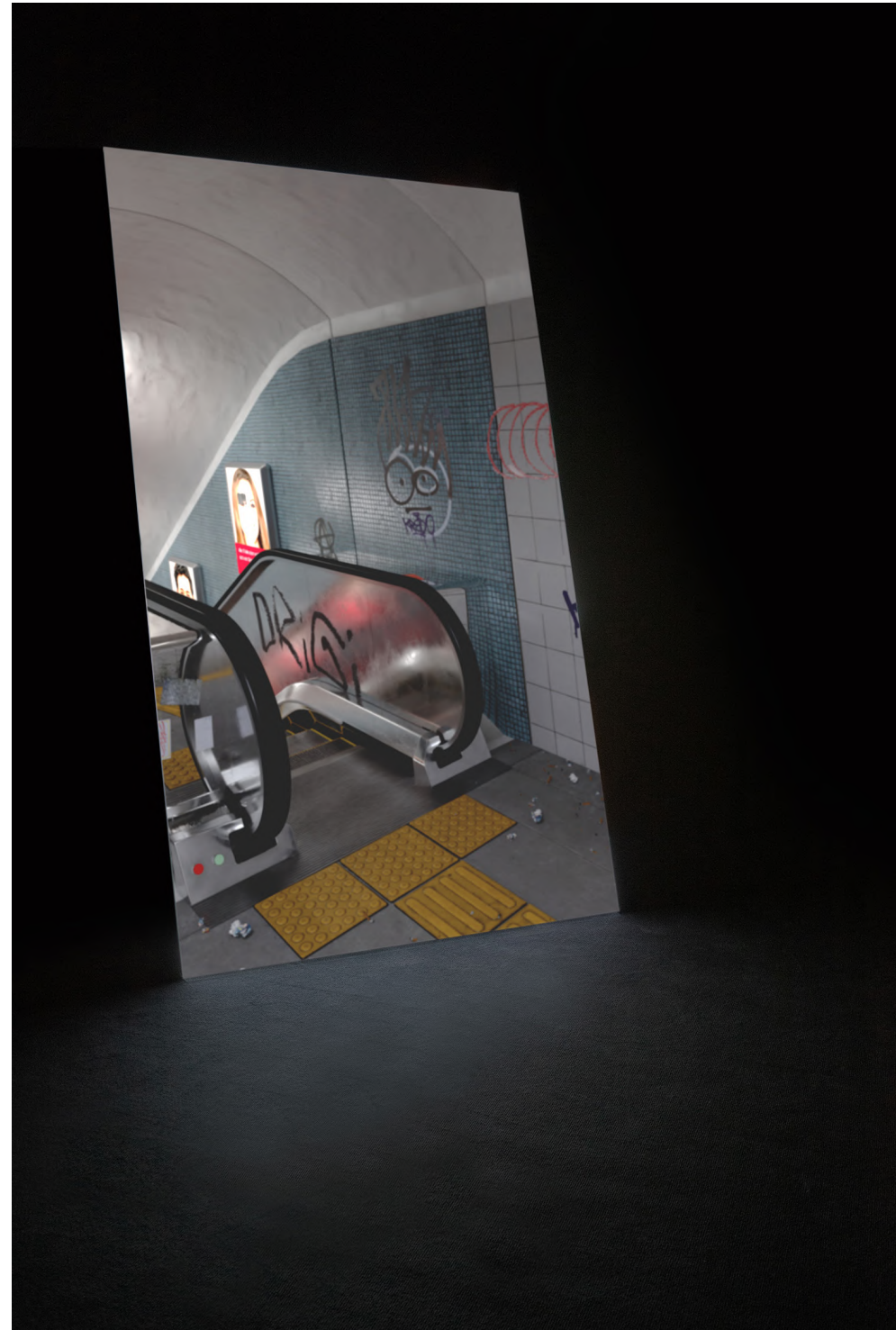

Where there's smoke, there's fire, they say—indicating that something must have happened prior to the occurrence of the smoke. Something that must have caused those cloudy trails. That smell.

But the thing is—it does not work both ways—where there's fire, there's not necessarily smoke. The fire realized that the smoke is a trace of its existence. It is the proof of its cause.

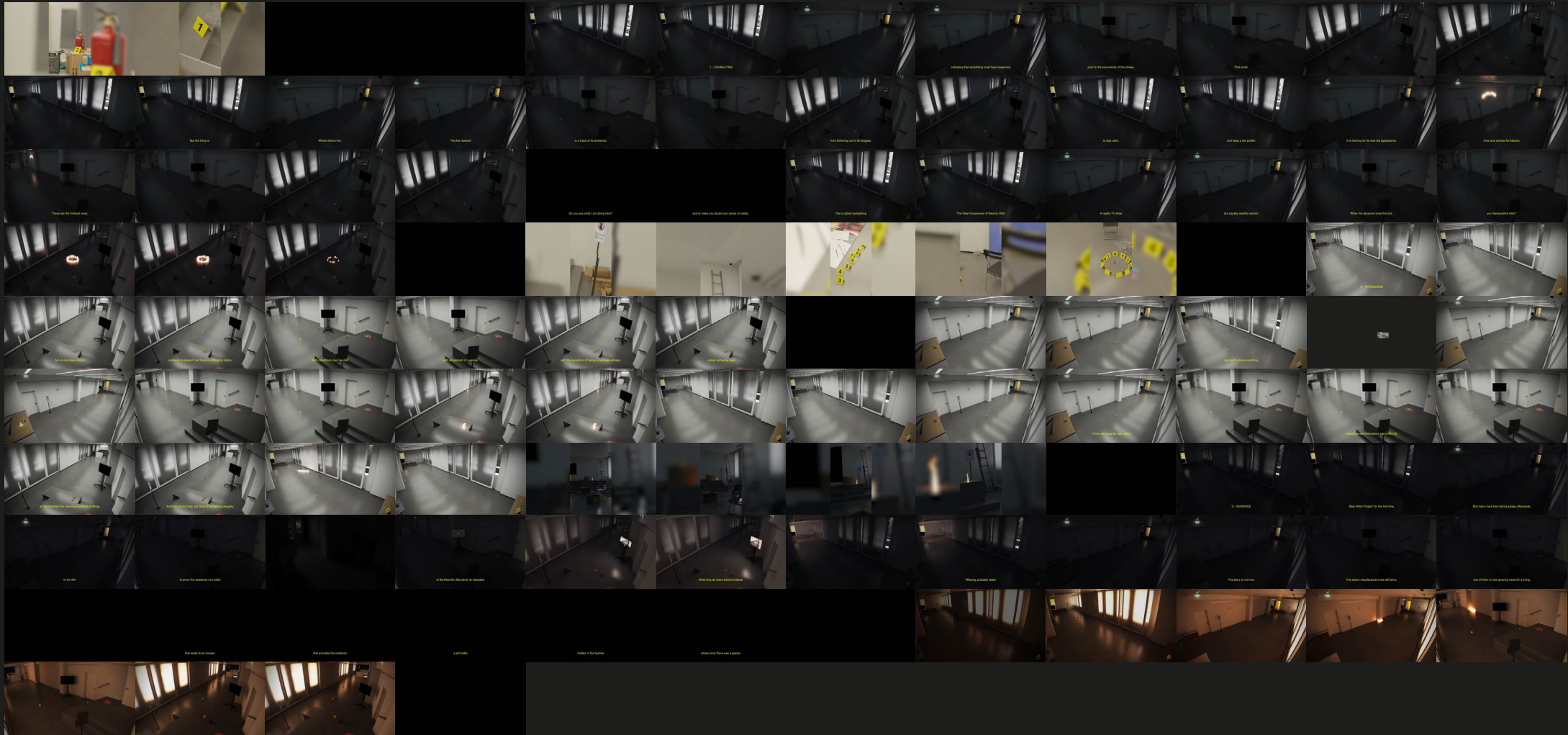
So the fire decided that it must burn more cautiously not to arouse suspicion. It needs to prevent the smoke from billowing out of its tongues. The fire tries to hold its breath, to stay calm, smoke a cigarette and keep a low profile. It is training for its next big appearance. Rehearsing circles, lines and vertical formations—these are the trickiest ones, they require the highest level of skill.

As of today, this work exists in 3 separate site specific editions. The first one was presented 2021 in Brussels at Deborah Bowmann, the second version mid-2022 in Berlin within the framework of the annual Goldrausch-alumni exhibition 'Tender Hooks', the third version in late 2022 at the Kasseler Dokfest's media art exhibition 'Monitoring'.

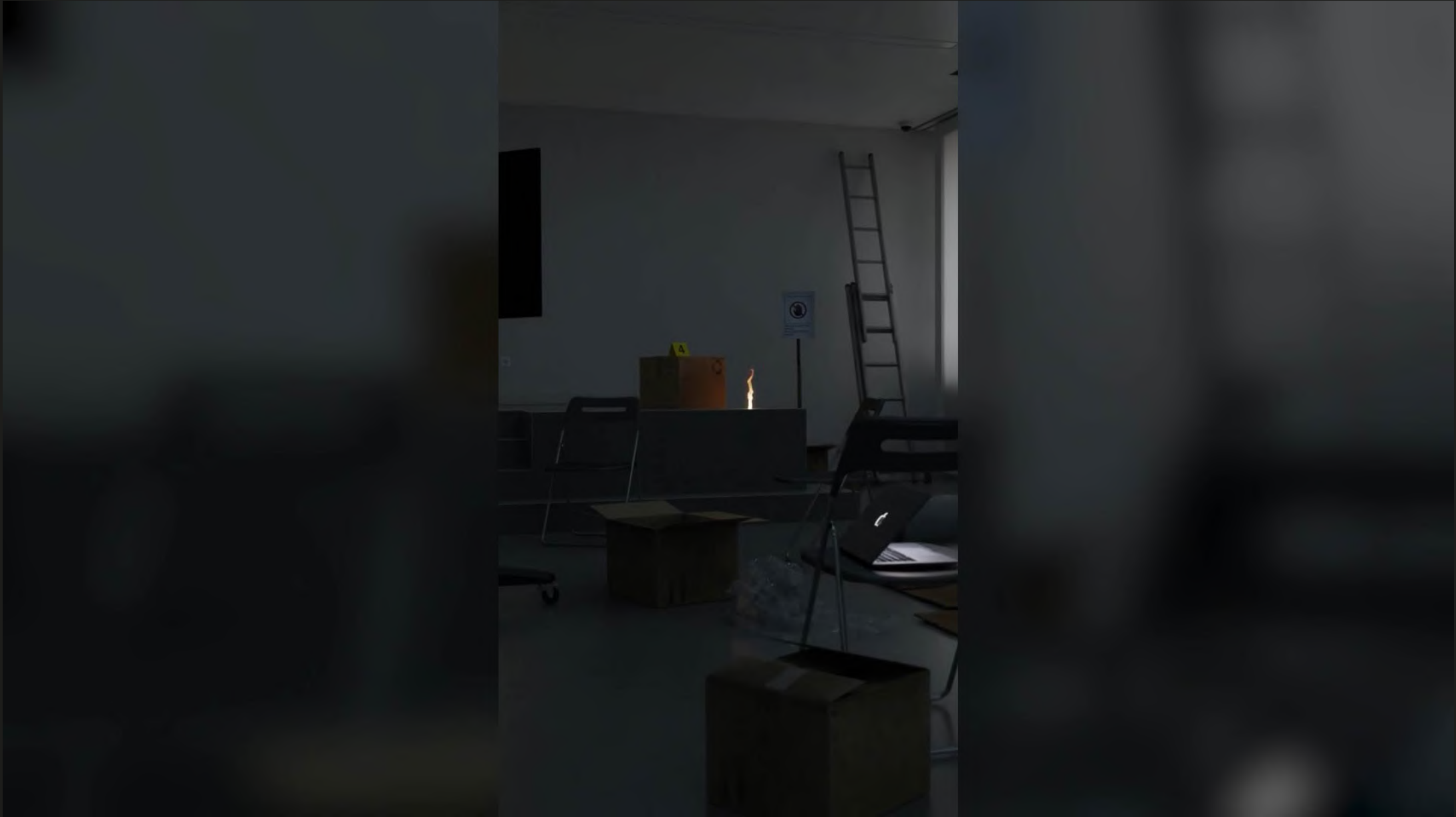

Nighttime. A plate is rotating around its own axis without tipping over. Several people around the world discover the mysterious incident during the night. They film it with their mobile devices and comment on it in their respective languages.

The work deals with the increasingly disappearing line between fact and fiction and the disputed notion of the photograph as being evidential as all scenes were built, textured and rendered with 3D Software, although appearing realistic. Silent Revolution plays with these circumstances and explores its speculative potential. It creates an altered string of reality—evidential material for a fictitious event.
